






To have a hospital-level committee to handle COI management instead of just 1 PHEC Coordinator




Confidentiality and data privacy in handle COI cases




Lack of clear guidelines or ethical standards in private practice and/or receiving funds/gifts from local government








Action Points (for PHEC)

Continuous Training and Advocacy




- Refresher Courses for existing staff

- Orientation for New Hires






Action Points (for the Offices)
